

Hi. Would you be interested in making any of these films? All are low budget and high concept. Mostly in the comedy genre with lots of irony. Based on true stories, with relevance to our real lives. Ordered according to budget for production, with examples of similar ones that had success:

1, *In Case of Death* Dramey *Royal Tannenbaums* — \$52 million
Magician Dash needs one of his estranged son's organs transplanted. The boy's willing but his wife and mother tell Dash to go try a spell.

2, *Konacti* Fantasy Horror *Lord of the Rings* — \$billions
Two teens warn neighbors to right past wrongs. A 150 year long-wave curse is only days away from massacring town folk.

3, *Pretty Stick* Science Dramey *Skin I Live In* — \$3 million
Discovering a functional Rife machine, Tory uses it to beautify his Mother, alienating everyone else. Powers greater than he demand retribution.

4, *Sneaky Fast* Sci Fi Action *Deadpool* — \$1/3 billion
Peter emerges from a medical experiment as the fastest sprinter on earth. Before his talent fades, he challenges professional athletes to race underground. When gamblers lose, they want to even the score.

5, *Counting Bounty* Crime Comedy *Enemy of State* — \$112 million
The deeper that Public Defender Declan digs into official records of the commonwealth, the harsher that the powers-that-be counter-attack, until Declan must choose between the truth and his family.

6, *Windfall* Naive Comedy *Small Time Crooks* — \$17 million
Stumbling upon a marijuana cache, UFO-buff Jesse dodges the angered gang to sell it to a visiting entertainer, to fund reviving his distressed hometown.

7, *Aida on Earth* Fantasy Science *Bruce Almighty* — \$1/4 billion
Two schizos resist their shrink to help demi-divine Aida complete the human genome whose gaps cause our blindspots and irrational behavior.

8, *SMO6* Crime of Class *Hustlers* — \$105 million
Using his prominent girlfriend as an alibi without her knowledge, Irwin forcibly tattoos white-collar criminal Bradley. But the wealthy are much more able to wreak revenge than indebted Irwin.

9, *Perfect Timing* Sci Fi Adventure *Tomorrowland* — \$93 million
Caterer Crik gets accidentally sucked into the future—a time when one chooses what age to die. Aided by Tepper (a distant descendant), Crik must prove that he

alone put society on its path to utopia. Or future authorities will return him to the exact moment he left—when bullets were bearing down on him.

10, *A Capo's Christmas* Adventure Com *Descendants* — \$83 million
To bequeath honor to his daughter, mafioso Delano forces a poor nation to adopt a proven way to generate prosperity, achieving what wannabe reformers could not—until the Old Guard fights back.

11, *The Most Famous Forgotten Man* Epic/Feature lgth *Gandhi* — \$58m
After his wilderness vision in 1870, inspirational Bennet was in demand all over the world as a public speaker. His moving love-letters captivate his lonely wife. In Ireland, Bennet was almost assassinated by English lords. In New York he won the mayorship but was cheated out of victory. Bennet predicted the last recession—150 years in advance.

12, *Paine: Creator of America* Epic / Series *The Patriot* — \$113 milin
The man who invented “the United States of America”, both the phrase and the nation. His writing inspired the colonials to keep faith in their darkest hour. He authored the world's first bestsellers. He gave away all he earned and was also a scientist and inventor. Three different governments tried to kill him. In prison, his spirit and wisdom consoled others condemned to die.

13, *Ghostberg's* Fantasy Comedy *Beetlejuice* — \$74 million
Genial ghosts, residents of an abandoned resort targeted for renovation, all of whom accidentally died “Darwin deaths”, must use their wits against a disturbed priest hired to exorcize them.
